Surgeon Commander Rob O'Donnell joined the Maritime Reserves in 2016. Originally joining HMS PRESIDENT, he then transferred to HMS DALRIADA having relocated to Glasgow. Quickly joining DALRIADA's Senior Management Team, he successfully undertook the roles of First Lieutenant and then Initial Naval Training Officer

In parallel to these unit roles, he is also an active member of the Maritime Reserve Medical Branch and was appointed as SO2 Medical Officers in 2021.
